Projects are never ending at Roseberry and this summer was no exception. Work continued on painting the McDougal General Store, getting the sill logs under the AX cabin, scraping and painting the Larkin House, refinishing the interior of the Whitney-Fairbrother School, installing an automatic sprinkler system behind the Barn and around the Finnish

cabins and Bandshell (northeast corner of our complex). Our thanks to an <u>anonymous donor</u> who provided considerable funding to get the job done. Now our events have good sod underfoot and our weddings have a greenscape on which to exchange vows and celebrate their special occasions.

Our thanks goes out to McCall's **Progressive Club** for a \$1,500 grant that funded painting the outside of the general store and renovating the interior of the



Whitney-Fairbrother school. The **Idaho Heritage Trust** awarded LVPS a \$7,000 matching grant to remove and replace the general store's roof. We have raised another \$4,000 towards this project through individual donations and at our Wednesday night concerts. Thanks goes out to the community for stepping up and helping LVPS with this important project. Recently, the **Laura Moore Cunningham Foundation** awarded LVPS with a \$5,000 grant that will go towards the roof replacement. Thank you!
